The poor white people in Charles County were worse off than the slaves; because they could not get any work to do, on the plantation, the slaves did all the work. Some time ago you asked did I ever see slaves sold. I have seen slaves tied behind buggies going to Washington and some to Baltimore. No one was taught to read.
